


School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Stockton Collegiate International Elementary expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Stockton Collegiate International Elementary is \$6,548,460.76, of which \$4,422,145.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$889,820.00 is other state funds, \$37,663.00 is local funds, and \$1,198,832.76 is federal funds. Of the \$1,198,832.76 in federal funds, \$299,215.76 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$4,422,145.00 in LCFF Funds, \$728,899.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Stockton Collegiate International Elementary plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.


Stockton Collegiate International Elementary plans to spend \$5,428,818.84 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$1,159,883.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$4,268,935.84 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

Stockton Collegiate's General Fund Expenditures outside of the Learning Continuity Plan, like expenditures within the Learning Continuity Plan, are focused on fulfilling the school's mission to provide equitable access to the rigorous IB programmes for students in the Stockton and surrounding area. These expenditures include salaries, curriculum, and supplies for the certificated personnel and materials appropriate and necessary to provide an authentic and rigorous Primary Years Program for kindergarten through fifth grade students.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity
Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, Stockton Collegiate International Elementary is projecting it will receive \$728,899.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what Stockton Collegiate International Elementary budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Stockton Collegiate International Elementary actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, Stockton Collegiate International Elementary's LCAP budgeted \$665,805.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Stockton Collegiate International Elementary actually spent \$682,444.38 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020.
